After teaching in numerous schools in the London area, she set out to travel the world, which has seen her settle in Australia to pursue her career as a dance teacher. Now based in Newcastle, Alice continues to teach her passion for dance, entering students for examinations from Pre-Primary through to Advanced levels, teaching workshops and recreational classes, and creating solos and troupes for eisteddfods.

Wishing to further develop herself, she completed her training with the Australian Dance Adjudicators (ADA) to begin her new journey as an adjudicator, allowing the opportunity to grow as a teacher and gain knowledge across the industry.

Alice also now runs Silver Swans classes throughout Newcastle, which is specially designed for adults and older learners. 'Silver Swans with Alice' ballet classes are open to people of all ages and abilities, including beginners and those wishing to return to dance.

Max McKenna – Hip Hop Teacher



At age 8 Max commenced tap lessons with Bling Performing Arts. Within a short period of time, he expanded to Drama and discovered his passion for Hip Hop. Max has competed at eisteddfods, starred in Hunter School of Performing Arts musical productions, and performed at Universal Studios and Disneyland in Los Angeles, Disneyworld in Orlando as well as on board the Royal Caribbean Freedom of the Seas cruise ship.


Hannah Pandel – Juniors and Mini Boppers Teacher

Tuition & Fee Structure

Fees are invoiced by the term according to classes in which students are enrolled. Once enrolled, students cannot withdraw mid-term. All term fees need to be paid for regardless of attendance. Single fees as well as bundles are outlined below and include GST.

Payments and Billing

Please read the following information carefully

- Student accounts need to be kept up-to-date. Once invoiced parents are required to finalise payments by no later than week 2 of each term
- If you would like to arrange another payment plan please contact Toni Zink prior to the commencement of the term by emailing **toni@blingperformingarts.com.au**
- If accounts are not finalised accordingly an extra \$10/week will be charged as interest
- All missed lessons, including concert rehearsals and private lessons must be paid for
- An annual registration fee of \$40 is to be paid by each family to cover Administration and APRA Licensing. This will be included in the first invoice

• Class withdrawals cannot be made during the term

Uniform

Black leotard with theatrical pink ballet stockings and canvas ballet shoes

ALL OTHER DANCE STYLES A range of t-shirts, singlets, shorts, pants and jackets are

available through our website. Each item has been custom designed and made to order from high quality fabric and includes the studio name and logo. Alternatively, students may wear any suitable combination of black clothes, e.g. black bike pants and singlet or t-shirt. Please refrain from wearing 'crazy' socks or scrunchies around the wrist.

PLEASE NOTE:

- Appropriate dance shoes/footwear must be worn in every lesson
- Please enquire about requirements before purchasing any new dance shoes

• Hair must be in a neat bun for ballet and neatly tied back from the face in a ponytail for other dance styles

Eisteddfods and Performance Troupes



Throughout the week many troupe classes are scheduled into the timetable. These classes are by invitation only as they are specifically for students who are part of the performance troupe.

Troupes showcase their talent throughout the year at many special events, promotional appearances and competitive eisteddfods.

An extra \$15 per term is invoiced to the participating students to cover additional costs such as eisteddfod entries. Some eisteddfods include Heritage Challenge of the Champions and Live to Dance.

Costuming fees may apply, especially for new students, or students who do not have specific requirements from the previous year's concert.

Troupes and Performance Group classes are invitation only.

Annual Concert



Every year the Bling Concert is held at St Phillips Christian College, Waratah during the first week of December.

In 2023 it will be on SATURDAY 9TH DECEMBER

The venue is a beautiful space to hold this showcase. Tickets are purchased directly from the college via their online portal. More information will be sent out closer to the date.

Students learn their routines and rehearse extremely hard during class to learn their routines and ensure a great show is presented. In Term 4 extra concert rehearsals are held on Saturdays at the studio. It is important that all students attend so they are well-prepared and familiar with the running of the concert and can learn the finale choreography.

The cost of these extra rehearsals will be included in Term 4

fees.

Concert Costumes



We begin planning and sourcing costumes mid-year. Most costumes are calculated at \$80 per routine, however with freight charges and overseas currency differences it may be a little extra. Any extra costume fees will be communicated and added to Term 4 accounts. Students will get to keep their costumes once the concert is finished.

To help with purchasing and to make it more affordable for families a costume levy is offered and recommended. Families will receive a costume levy invoice at the end of Term 1. Regular online transfers into a separate bank account are required once costume fees are invoiced.

All outstanding costume fees at the end of Term 2 will be added to Term 3 accounts.

Fundraising

Fundraising occurs sporadically throughout the year to help the students of Bling Performing Arts. In the past proceeds have been used to purchase water tanks for the students and subsidize the cost of costumes such as tutus and tap boots. If you'd like to get involved, please contact the studio.
